

Wills, estate inventories, estate sales, and guardian financial reporting are all in the microfilm called WILLS AND INVENTORY. Booklet 18 and 19 covers app. 700 pages of Will Book I and II.

In the wills, I have deleted some of the legal terminology..."Be it remembered in the county of Houston and in the state of Tennessee, I" by using...Also, if the calls for the land area are marks no longer findable "north to the rock pile...w to forked hickory", I have omitted this. If the calls for the land area include a person's line, creek, road, etc., it is listed.

A personal inventory and sale is listed completely including name of item, buyer, and amount paid. Three store inventories are shortened but all buyers are listed and all items are listed at least once. Example: the E.D.Boone store took two days to sell the contents and there are 60 pages of entries (20 pr. of suspenders were sold to 20 buyers). You may find an item listed in the inventory that is still in the family. There will be items sold that you do not know what they are-example: steelyards are a type of balance scale.

The TABLE OF CONTENTS at the beginning is listed in the order it is listed in the Will Book with the symbol (W) for will (I) for inventory and (G) guardian report. These are also listed on the index at the end in alphabetical order. There is no date on some of these items so you will have to estimate by using the date of the item before and the item after.

INDEX of buyers, people who owed the estate money, witnesses to the documents, administrators, are listed by surname only in the index and a (*) is placed by the surname if the surname has more than ten (10) entries

Hopefully, this will allow some of you to put more "meat" on an ancestor's skeleton. As I have suggested to several of you, if you don't like, for some reason, your immediate ancestor, go back a few generations and you may find some you do like. The following may be appropriate for booklet 18 and 19.

When you peer into the branches
of your new-found family tree,
Imagine faces 'neath the branches
as they're looking back at thee.

On those limbs will be some knots
and some may have some scars,
Some knots may be repulsive

GEORGE RAUSCHER (dec) Will and inventory—Stewart County Court—January 3, 1870
page 1 through 8

Be it remembered that heretofore at a county court begun on Monday the 3rd day of January 1870 and held at the court house in the Town of Dover for the County of Stewart for the State of Tennessee when the following among other proceedings were had. To witt...a copy of the last will and testament of GEORGE RAUSCHER was produced in open court...GEORGE E RAUSCHER was ordered before court that he have letters of administration with the will attached of GEORGE RAUSCHER, deceased and he enter into bond in the sum of Five Thousand dollars. J.L. McMillan and C.C.Rauscher as his securities...

In the name of God Amen. I GEORGE RAUSCHER of the county of Beaver in the State of Pennsylvania...do make and publish this my last will and testament...First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, CAROLINE, one third of my whole estate during the time of her natural life then said third to be equally divided among my children. The balance of my estate, I will to be divided equally among all my children, share and share alike...I will and bequeath LIZZIE two hundred dollars (\$200), MAGGIE two hundred dollars (\$200), GEORGE E two hundred dollars (\$200), CHARLES C one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) and the balance of my estate to be divided equally between my eleven children—share and share alike and my father and mother (GEORGE and MARGARET RAUSCHER) to be kept out of my estate during the term of their natural lives. To my sister MARGARET HOAZE two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250), her father's estate, and...appoint my two sons G.E. and CHARLES C. to be the executors of my last will and testament...Seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.

I, Darius Singleton, Register for the probate of wills for Beaver County do hereby certify that the foregoing is a true and full copy of the last will and testament of GEORGE RAUSCHER, dec.

DANIEL McMILLAN and W.B.NICHOLS, JR. to be appointed commissioners to lay off one years provisions to the widow of JESSEE BALLENTINE deceased...

Be it remembered...6th day of December 1869...County of Stewart...presiding T.F.Elliott, chairman Isaac Williams and H.H.Trinkle, Esqrs...application of B. RICHARDSON it is ordered by the court that he have letters of administration on the estate of ZEBULON GARRISON, deceased, and he enter into bond in the sum of two hundred dollars with P.F. TAVEL and ED WALTER as securities...collect and pay all debts and to do and transact all business duties which lawfully devolve on you ...

Report of settlement with B. RICHARDSON, adm. of ZEBULON GARRISON, dec. On the 21st day of January 1870, B. RICHARDSON made suggestion to me in writing that the estate of said deceased was insolvent...In order that the same might distribute pro rata among the creditors, the Court of Stewart County made an order...to give notice by advertisement in some newspaper and also on the County House door in the Town of Dover for all persons having claims against the estate...

BEVERLY BEACHAM'S WILL

page 17-18

In the name of God Amen...I do make and publish this the following my last will and testament...First, I desire my funeral expenses and debts, which are few, be paid. Second, I give and bequeath all my tract of land on which I now live containing fifth acres (entered in the name of JOSEPH SHOLES by Grant No. 255), also all my household and kitchen furniture, all my horses and stock of all and every kind unto my beloved wife JEMIMA BEACHAM and daughter JEMIMA ELVINE BEACHAM also the proceeds of four notes due on H.H. HUSBY for about \$60, on R.A.SHOLES for about \$10 and on JAMES COLLINS and CARROLL COOK all amounting to about eighty or ninety dollars all of which I bequeath to them as their share of my estate. Third, I give and bequeath to my daughter ELIZABETH A RUSHING, six acres of land beginning at the south-east corner of a fifty acre tract granted BENJAMIN MCINTOSH running west and north so as to make six acres. That and what I heretofore gave her is her equitable share. Fourth, I give and bequeath to my son HENRY BEACHAM, one tract of land containing forth acres granted to me-Grant 18595- and also the remainder of the McIntosh grant which is forty-four acres which is in all eighty-four acres to him and his heirs as his equitable share of my estate. Fifth, I give and bequeath to my son JOHN G. BEACHAM the remainder of a debt that he owes me which is about \$10 and what he has had heretofore is his equitable share of my estate. Sixth, I give and bequeath heretofore to

JESSEE BEACHAM, one tract of land which is an equitable share of my estate. Seventh, I give unto my son ALEXANDER J. BEACHAM in his lifetime one tract of land which is an equitable share of my estate. Eighth, I give and bequeath to my grandson WILLIAM BALDING, five dollars to be paid out of my estate. Ninth, This is my will and dear friend ROBERT A. SCHOLES be my executor of this my land will and testament...29th day of September 1871.

I, JOSIAH CLARK, do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First, I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of or my first money that comes into the hands of my executor. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my wife ELIZABETH CLARK a good and comfortable support during her natural life or widowhood. Thirdly, After the death of my said wife, I desire that all of my perishable property be converted into cash and apply the proceeds to the following purposes, to wit: first, pay the funeral expenses of my said wife. Secondly, pay my son JESSEE S. CLARK one dollar, Thirdly, to my daughter MARY MATHIS one dollar, Fourthly, to my daughter NANCY DUFF one dollar, Fifthly to my daughter MARTHA P. CLARK one dollar, Sixthly to my daughter ELIZABETH MADDEN one dollar. Seventhly, to the heirs of JOHN B. CLARK one dollar each. Finally, I give and bequeath to my son HENRY E CLARK, all of my lands not heretofore conveyed and all of what may remain of the proceeds of my perishable property to have and to hold the same during his natural life and at his death to his wife during her natural life or widowhood and then to their two sons WILLIAM JAMES CLARK and JOHN H.M.CLARK. Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint J.L.McMillan my executor.

I, in the name of God, Amen...First, I want my funeral expenses paid as soon after my death as possible and next, I give my beloved wife, MARY M. NICHOLS all of the property she had when her and I married, both household and kitchen furniture and all the cattle, (except the oxen) and the hogs and the sheep that is marked in her mark and the black mare and the young mule that we call Lucy and all the plows and hoes and plowing gear. I also give my houses and farm to my wife for her lifetime or widowhood. If she should marry, then the houses and farm goes to my children and if she does not marry, then at her death, it goes to my children and the rest of my property, I dispose of after the following manner. I give my son one feather bed and furniture and my gold watch and I give my daughter ELIZABETH JANE NICHOLS one feather bed and furniture and bedstead and her sister MARY'S side saddle and I want my oxen and wagon and sorrel mule and all my hogs and sheep and all the rest of my things sold and my debts paid and if there is any money left after my debts is paid, I want it divided equally between my son WILLIAM B. NICHOLS and my daughter ELIZABETH JANE NICHOLS and after the death or marriage of my wife, I want my son WILLIAM B. NICHOLS to have one third of my land and ELIZABETH JANE NICHOLS one third and ISAC N. NICHOLS' two daughters the other third and I appoint my son WILLIAM B. NICHOLS my executor to wind up and settle my estate as ordered in this will. I also want my wife to have a wheel and cards and one years' provisions for herself and family.

But I devise the said land to my said children ROBERT, WALKER and MARGARET, with this condition that they are to support my idiotic daughter REBECCA BUCHANAN during her natural life and in the event of their failure or incapacity to do so, then my executor is to sell said land whether publically or privately and apply the proceeds to the support of my idiotic daughter, REBECCA, so long as she may live and should she die leaving a balance in the hands of my executor, then the same is to be distributed equally among my surviving children.
